So he went to the field and asked the... sheep.

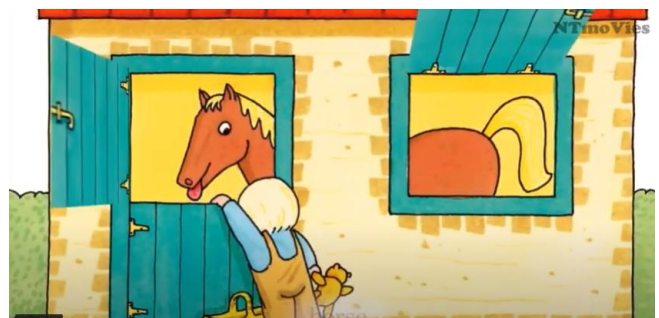
No eggs here. Oh dear!

Singing old mc Donald and other nursery rhymes that relate to farm animals. For example, This little piggy, baa baa black sheep. You can add musical instruments if you have any as you sing as this helps children to explore new sounds.

If you have any farm animals, you could hide the animals around your house or garden and go on a hunt for the animals. Talking about the animals you find and the noises they make. This will help promote language skills.
